

Minutes of the 18th meeting of the Board of Governors (BoG) of Central Institute of Technology (CIT) Kokrajhar held on 11th March, 2019 (Monday) at Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi.

m No. 18.01:

Confirmation of the Minutes of the 17th Meeting of the Board of Governors (BoG) of CIT Kokrajhar held on 25th July, 2018 at Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi.

The Minutes of the 17th Meeting of the BoG held on 25th July, 2018 at Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi was circulated amongst the members. As no comments were received from any of the members, the minutes of the 17th meeting were places before the board for confirmation.

Resolution: As no comments were received, the members confirmed the minutes of the 17th meeting of the BoG.

Item No. 18.02:

Action taken Report (ATR) on the resolutions of the 17th Meeting of the BoG.

An ATR had been prepared on the resolutions of the 17th Meeting of the BoG and was placed at the meeting. Members were requested to discuss the ATR and to suggest further course of action if any, that may be considered necessary.

Resolution: The members noted the ATR as reported by the institute. However for item no 14.03 member representing IFD informed that further the institute would be funded through HEFA. In light of this they have suggested to increase the IRG of the institute.

Item No. 18.03:

Approval of Deemed to be University notification of MHRD.

Central Institute of Technology (CIT) Kokrajhar had been declared as an "Institution deemed to be University" by the Ministry of Human Resource Development of the Government of India vide the Notification No. F.9-1/2016-U3(A) dated December 13, 2018 of the MHRD, Govt. of India. A copy of the notification was placed before the board for approval.

Resolution: The members approved the notification and suggested the institute to follow the clauses as notified.

Item No. 18.04:

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Proposal for approval of programmes (Diploma, UG and PG) to be started under the new status of Deemed to be University of the institute.

As per the new status of Deemed to be University of CITK, the existing institute had applied for progressive closure. For AICTE approval of its programmes, the institute had simultaneously applied afresh as a new institute in the same premise to be started from the academic year 2019-20. The programmes that were

Resolution: The members approved the proposal of progressive closure of the existing institute. The board also had given its approval for starting a new institute in the same premise from the academic year 2019-20.

Regarding the proposed programmes of the new institute, the members had a discussion on the availability of associated infrastructures and manpower. After threadbare discussion, the board decided to start the following programmes in a phase wise manner.

Item No. 18.05:

Approval of amended MoA and rules of the institute.

In view of the new status of the institute, the Memorandum of Association (MoA) and the rules of the institute was amended. A copy of the same was placed before the board. Members were requested to comment on that.

Resolution: The board approved the amended MoA and rules of the institute.

Item No. 18.06:

Proposal for approval of the policy documents of the institute pertaining to the Deemed University status.

Keeping in view the clauses mentioned in the referred notification of MHRD, the institute had drafted the academic ordinances for its programmes of various levels (Diploma, UG and PG). The draft ordinances were placed before the board for approval.

It was also proposed that, the unspent amount of PDA in a block period of three-years may be carry-forward to the next three-year block period for better utilisation of the academic facility. Members were requested to comment on that

Resolution: The proposed academic ordinances were approved by the board.

The carry-forward of PDA from a block period of three-years to the next three-year block period was not approved.

Item No. 18.07:

Proposal for providing non-compounded PhD increments to the teachers completing PhD while in service.

Representations were received from the faculty members of the institute regarding entitlement of increments to the teachers completing PhD while in service. As per the gazette notification No. 271, dated July 18, 2018, teachers who have completed their PhD degree while in service shall be entitled to three non-compounded increments fixed at increment applicable at entry level only. Members were requested to approve the proposal for implementation of the same in the institute.

Resolution: The board approved the proposal for providing noncompounded PhD increments to the teachers completing PhD while in service in line with the notification published by MHRD in this connection.

Recruitment of Institute engineer

In order to drive the campus development activities of Central Institute of Technology Kokrajhar, particularly in facilitating its functioning under the newly acquired role as a Deemed to be University, the Institute urgently required direct recruitment of an Institute Engineer at a senior level. The need of Institute Engineer had arisen because of the requirement of

- Government, e.g. with the Chief, the Deputy Chief and concerned Secretaries of the Bodoland Territorial Council (BTC); with the Chief Engineer and the Deputy Chief Engineer of the Public Works Department of BTC; with the Chief General Manager of the Assam Power Distribution Company Limited etc., for matters related to acceleration of progress of work, mitigation of problems arising from local issues, such as encroachment, interference in contracting process, etc;
- ii) High level of engineering experience and technological knowledge in project Planning including preparation of master plan; estimating and costing; preparing Detailed Project Reports; contracting including tendering, award or work, monitoring of physical as well as financial progress; project management; inventory control; etc. as are envisaged for implementation of infrastructure projects in the Institute's campus, particularly in the newly acquired land of about 100 acres, that are envisaged to be extensive and of high values;
- iii) Creation, guidance, supervision of a team of competent staff at the Engineering Cell and the Estate Office of the Institute that would undertake, process and accomplish the construction of various small and large engineering projects, maintenance of already created assets, etc.

In view of the above, the appointment of a suitably experienced engineering professional was required in the post of Institute Engineer instead of the existing vacant sanctioned post of Executive Engineer. The recruitment rules (RR) for the post had been prepared in line with the IIT, Ropar which was also in its developmental phase and had the post of Institute Engineer. The draft RR for the said post was placed before the board. Members were requested to approve the RR.

Item No.18.9:

Resolution: The proposal for creation of various teaching and non-teaching posts is under process with MHRD. Institute was suggested to inform MHRD for such requirement afresh in line with the new status of Deemed to be University.

To consider the Minutes of the 6st Academic Committee meeting held on 25th January, 2019 at the Director's conference room of CIT Kokrajhar.

The Minutes of the 6th Academic Committee Meeting held on 25th January, 2019 was recommended for approval /ratification.

In view of the above, the below mentioned points were placed for noting.

- (a) DPR had already been submitted to MHRD towards up gradation of the Institute and
 - (b) The proposal for sanctioning faculty and staff member for the existing programmes was under the consideration of MHRD for concurrence.
- An urgent requirement to start the programmes in the coming 2019-2020
 academic session with limited number of students entry and accordingly
 advertisements were to be floated with the following:
 - (a) For providing stipend/ TA/RA-ship to PG students, and institute's fellowship to PhD scholars in the session 2019-2020, an additional amount of fund to be included in the next financial year's budget allocation.
 - (b) Approval and sanction of engagement of experts relevant to the subject domain at senior level on specific contract basis as Honorary/ Adjunct/ Distinguished/ deputation/ Invited faculty (including retired persons) to initiate the de-novo courses, till the DPR is approved and become functional. Involvement of 12 such persons would be required for starting six De-novo programmes (2 per programme). An amount of Rs. 540 lakhs (including TA/DA and others for 2 semesters) may be marked as additional requirement to the next year's budget allocation. This arrangement may be approved for the next 5 years that would be helpful for obtaining permanency of deemed to be University status as laid down by MHRD notification.

The Members are requested to approve the same.

Resolution: The Minutes of the 6th Academic Committee Meeting was approved in principle by the members. However the honorarium to be given to the faculty members should be worked out and placed afresh in the budget proposal.

Similarly the proposal of providing stipends to the PG and PhD students needs to be reworked and placed in the budget proposal.

Item No.18.12: Reporting on some significant activities of the institute.

- As per the 7th CPC and relevant all pay revision exercises have been completed.
- Engaging Prof. Debkumar Chakrabarti as distinguished Professor in the department of Multimedia Communication and Design.

Prof. Debkumar Chakrabarti, Dept. of Design, IIT Guwahati and the officiating Director of the institute has been allowed to guide the UG, PG and PhD students of the institute as a distinguished professor in the department of Multimedia Communication and Design with the approval of the Chairman, BoG. His guidance will enable the students to explore how the art, craft and aesthetics may be facilitated through the communication of the design interventions for all round development of the society. IIT Guwahati consent for PhD guidance has been taken and approval of chairman BoG has been obtained.
