### Guidelines for Abstract Submission

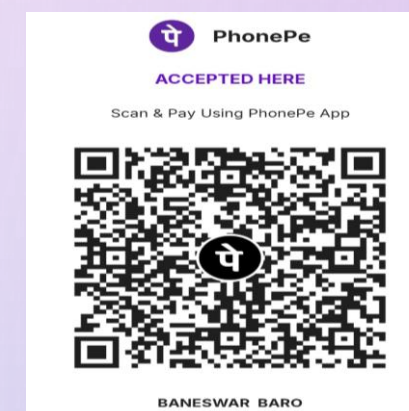
